

Jamiya's Journal

When Jamiya was just 6 months old, she came aboard the S.S. La Rabida inpatient unit as one of the hospital's youngest rehab patients after a near drowning incident. Jamiya spent three hours a day in therapy, working to relearn skills like holding her head up and sitting upright. After being discharged, Jamiya continued to visit La Rabida for outpatient physical, occupational, speech, and developmental therapies. Here, Jamiya worked closely with Molly, a La Rabida physical therapist. "I saw her for physical therapy from one year of age until she was close to 4," said Molly. "We worked to regain the gross motor skills she had lost in her accident, then surpass them to stand and walk on her own."

As she grew up and her skills improved, Jamiya's treatment changed and she and Molly no longer worked together. But, that didn't mean that the bond had been broken. This spring, Jamiya and her mom, Clovetta, created a journal filled with photos of Jamiya and Molly, showcasing her journey through therapy to where she is today. "The journal we created for Molly was full of history and shows the bond we share," says Clovetta. "The pictures show the time Molly took to help Jamiya from 6 months old up." By working together for a long period of time, Molly's dedication to helping Jamiya get stronger made a lasting impact that Jamiya still carries with her today.

"When I saw the journal sitting on my desk and began to leaf through it, tears poured from my eyes," says Molly. "The tears were a combination of being floored with the thoughtfulness that this family took time to make this beautiful book for me that documented the time Jamiya and I worked together as well as feelings of pride as to how far Jamiya has come."
