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


Rayvin, London's mother, had a very healthy

As a concerned mother, Rayvin took London to their pediatrician, where she was told London had some abnormal tightness in her body. London started receiving treatment at a private therapy institution to treat the tightness, but was on the hunt for a place that specialized in children. "We live in Hyde Park, and everyone in the community knew about La Rabida," shares Rayvin. "When we came to the hospital for the first time, we instantly fell in love." Upon arriving to La Rabida, London was diagnosed

improvements right off the bat," shares Rayvin. "Her stomach muscles are getting stronger and her speech has gotten much better due to the strengthening of her trunk muscles." Because of the stiffness in her arms and hands, London previously struggled to hold a pencil, making it nearly impossible to learn how to write. With the help of her therapists and her strong will, London garnered the strength to grasp a pencil and is now able to write her name, trace, and color all on her own. Thanks to La Rabida, London also discovered one of her favorite activities – swimming. It all started with the aquatic therapy that took place here at the hospital. "Taking therapy into the pool has been amazing," says Rayvin. "Because London has a disability that impacts her mobility, she is limited on the things she can do. Giving her the opportunity to take therapy

in the pool has been a game changer and has given her a sense of independence." With the help of a specialized life vest courtesy of our Pay it Forward program, London can now move

freely throughout the pool. Swimming, while fun, also forces London to engage all of her muscles, making them stronger in the long run. "We have seen such growth in the pool,"

shares Rayvin. Because of the consistent physical and occupational therapy, London is getting stronger every single day. "I've never felt so close to a team of doctors or therapists than I have at La Rabida," shares Rayvin. "La Rabida is the foundation of all of London's progress."

This September, we are recognizing National Sickle Cell Awareness Month. Affecting nearly 100,000 Americans, sickle cell disease is a genetic disorder that affects the hemoglobin, the molecule in red blood cells that delivers oxygen to the body. Those with sickle cell disease have blood cells that were formed in a curved, sickle shape. These sickle shaped cells have difficulty passing through small blood vessels and block blood flow. This



Through discussions, role plays, activities, presentations, and social interaction, children have heightened their ability to share their experiences and become allies to stand up to bullies in all areas of their lives.
