When you're a parent of a child with a chronic medical condition, such as sickle cell, it can be overwhelming and all consuming. But, with the right medical team as a support system, it can help alleviate some of that fear.

Meet Marcus. He's one of the 100,000 Americans living with sickle cell disease.

"As a parent, it's difficult to watch Marcus live with sickle cell," shares Ashley, Marcus' mom. "Early on, Marcus was hospitalized every other month, sometimes twice in a month, because of pain crises." Sometimes, those pain crises prevented Marcus from

participating in fun activities like birthday parties, playdates, and even Halloween. "Marcus has never celebrated Halloween. Every Halloween he is in the hospital," shares Ashley.


