Kairo Walks Out of La Rabida



Two year old Kairo first arrived at La Rabida's Acute Care Clinic in December after his mother found him nearly unresponsive at daycare. After stabilizing him, Kairo was transferred by EMS for higher-level care for seizures and non-responsiveness. He was intubated, had a ventricular hemorrhage caused by a ruptured AVM with 8mm aneurysm, and eventually became trach-dependent with a g-tube (for feeding) and a shunt to drain fluid from his brain. Kairo was very sick.

After spending a month and a half in the pediatric intensive care unit, Kairo returned to La Rabida still on ventilator support, had very little movement, and could not speak. But, the first thing his dad said was "When Kairo is discharged, I want to see him walk out on his own." And this month, that is exactly what he did.

ASCEND Program Now Open to All



For the first time La Rabida's ASCEND (Assistance and Support for Caregivers as they Embark in New Healthcare Directions) program is being offered to the public. This free support program helps parents and caregivers of teens and adolescents with disabilities navigate the overwhelming process of guardianship and transitioning to adult care. ASCEND provides essential guidance on guardianship and the shift to adult healthcare and services, including a packet of printed materials, presentations, and four evening Zoom sessions on topics like transition readiness, Social Security changes, school transitions, guardianship, and community resources with our director of Inpatient Case Management & Outpatient Care Coordination Services & Social Work. Christina's passion for this type of work led her to relaunch the ASCEND program in a virtual format during COVID. She continues to host it online to make it more accessible for caregivers. Now, we're proud to extend this program to those in the community who are facing these challenges as well.
